Summary

April 2017 Update

Resolution

Agreements reached with **ALL** property owners in the wellban area whose properties were devalued by the tax assessor.

Remediation

Supplemental remediation activities continuing when necessary to mitigate plume migration with ADEQ oversight.

Validation

Ongoing extensive testing continues to confirm the absence of health risks.

Redevelopment

Collective efforts have resulted in sale of the property for re-use to benefit the entire community.



Looking Forward

Semi-annual groundwater monitoring events each year in March/April and October/November.


Settlement Agreements Reached With All Residents

- 116 Monitoring Wells

Results Show Continued Progress








- No exposure pathways to cause health risk to residents, workers, employees or visitors at the former manufacturing property, residential properties or the Boys and Girls Club
- Continued reductions in TCE from active remediation activities
- Semi-annual groundwater monitoring and reporting to ADEQ to continue to monitor site and off-site conditions.
